Fences

The City of Pueblo has 2 ordinances regarding fences, and fence materials:



PMC Sec. 17-4-22 Fences, Walls and Hedges

- Except as prohibited in Chapter 2 of Title XV of this Code, fences, walls and hedges may be permitted in any required yard, or along the edge of any yards.
- Title XV Chapter 2 discusses regulations for municipal parking lots and is not related to fencing of private property.

PMC Sec. 11-1-405

(b) Specific nuisances. The following substances, activities or conditions are hereby expressly deemed to be detrimental to the health or safety of the inhabitants of this City and are nuisances:

(5) The construction, installation, erection, keeping or maintenance of a barbed wire, electrically charged, sheet metal or corrugated metal fence or fences on any property located within a residential zone district.

Other jurisdictions with similar ordinances:

- City of Arvada
 - Prohibited materials:
 - Sheet plastic
 - Sheet metal
 - Chicken wire
 - Fabric materials
 - Fiberboard
 - Garage door panels
 - Snow fencing
 - Rope
 - Plywood fences
 - PVC pipe
 - Misc. materials

Other Jurisdictions with similar ordinances:

- Glenwood Springs
 - The following fencing materials are prohibited:
 - Except in the I1 and I2 zoning districts, chain link fencing when located in the front yard or in a side yard that is adjacent to and visible from a public right-of-way
 - Corrugated or ribbed metal
 - Corrugated plastic
 - Plastic and vinyl
 - Barbed wire.

Other Jurisdictions with similar ordinances:

- Aurora
 - Prohibited fences, walls and materials:
 - Electrically charged fences
 - Sharp pointed fences
 - Barbed wire fences
 - Concertina wire or similar
 - Chicken wire, corrugated metal, fabric materials, fiberboard, garage door panels, plywood, snow fencing, agricultural rope and misc. materials

Potential options



Ordinance remains the same and metal fencing not allowed for safety reasons.



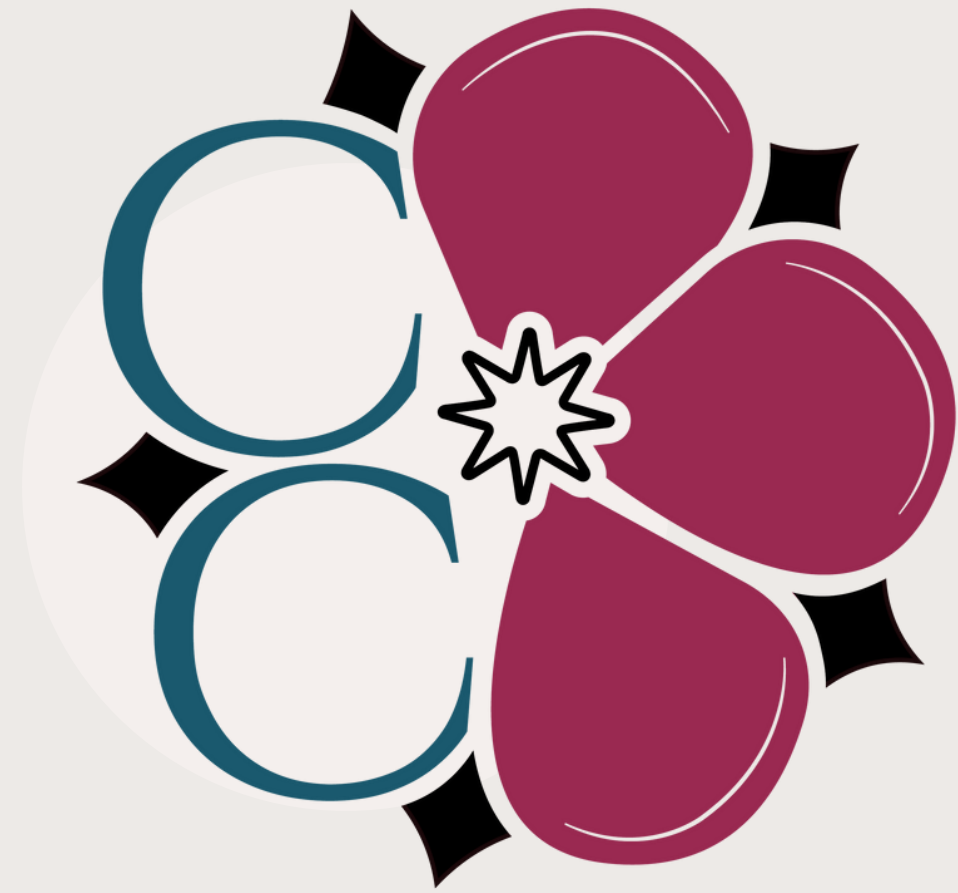
Amend the ordinance to allow for metal fencing with upgrades such as-no bare edges, must be capped with wood or other rust-resistant materials.



Permit required for this type of fence to ensure it is engineered properly and can withstand high winds, and extreme weather conditions.

- We believe that supporting and encouraging one another leads to better outcomes for everyone.



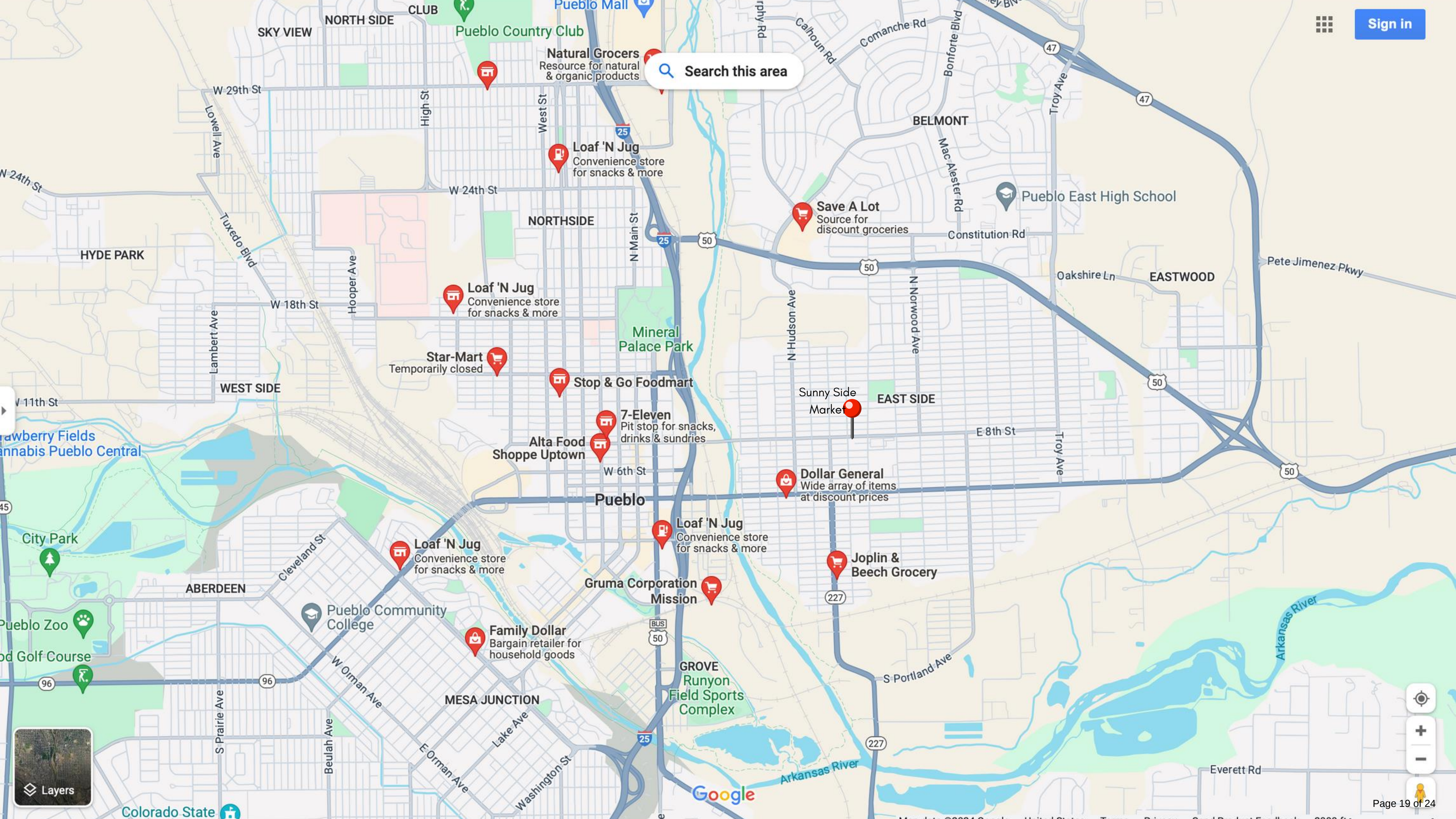
The Problem

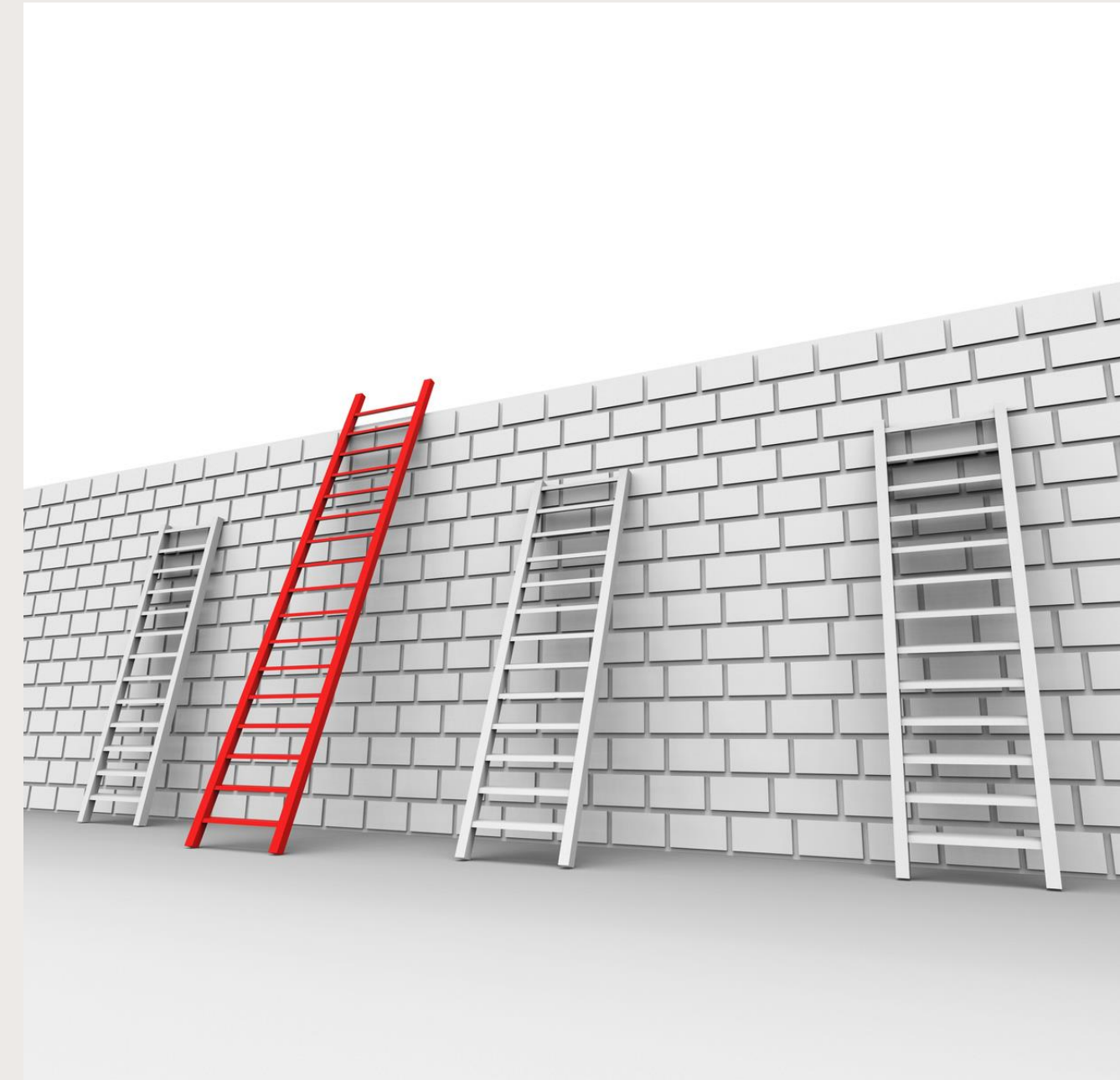
