Small Business Vandalism Relief

Case for action

- The Problem
 - Increase in vandalism of storefronts — especially broken windows and doors
 - Small businesses are forced to operate behind damaged or boarded windows
 - Broken windows are more than cosmetic
 - Broken Windows Theory: Visible neglect encourages further disorder and crime
- The Impact
 - Small business owners can't absorb ongoing repair costs
 - Recurring vandalism creates a heavy financial burden including boarding, securing, and repairs
 - Consequences include loss of foot traffic, weaker community confidence, and stalled economic growth



The solution

Small Business Vandalism Repair Mini-Grant Program

- \$50,000 investment from the City to help businesses afford window and door repairs
 - \$1,000 maximum reimbursement for glass repair per business
 - Assist max of 50 small businesses in Pueblo's commercial districts
- Quick, visible impact
 - Removes blight, restores pride, boosts safety
- Leverages private investment
 - Businesses cover any costs beyond the grant
- Citywide Benefit
 - Safer, more attractive business fronts encourage shopping and services
- Customer Confidence
 - Reduced blight increases foot traffic and community pride

The process

Businesses must:

- Be in good standing with the City and Sec of State
- Turn in their police report of the vandalism
- Submit receipts of the window repair for reimbursement

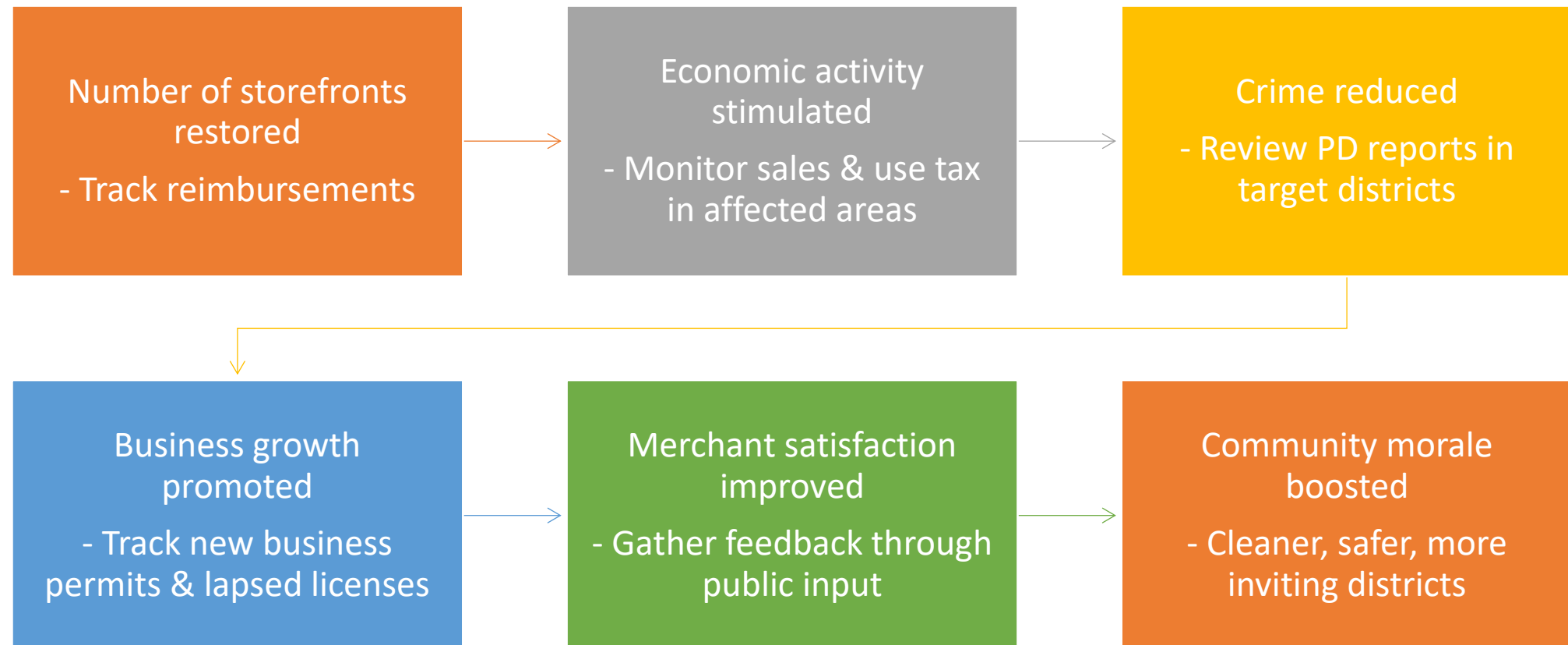
Mayor's office will receive and coordinate the applications

The City of Pueblo Finance Department will issue a check directly to the business

- Reimbursement may be made once per year per business

The damage has had to have occurred *after* Council approval

Next steps

- We'll see an ordinance to create an account and appropriate the funds
 - Looking to use a portion of the ARPA interest account to cover the expenses so funds are not coming out of general fund
