Funding Request:

\$50,000/year for 3 years in a formal service agreement to provide out of school time care for youth at Ray Aguilera Teen Center at Central High School, East Side Clubhouse at Risley Middle School and Sprague Clubhouse

What this funding makes possible:

- Affordable out-of-school care for families in a childcare desert
- Stable operations in a geographically isolated community
- Protection against federal funding uncertainty

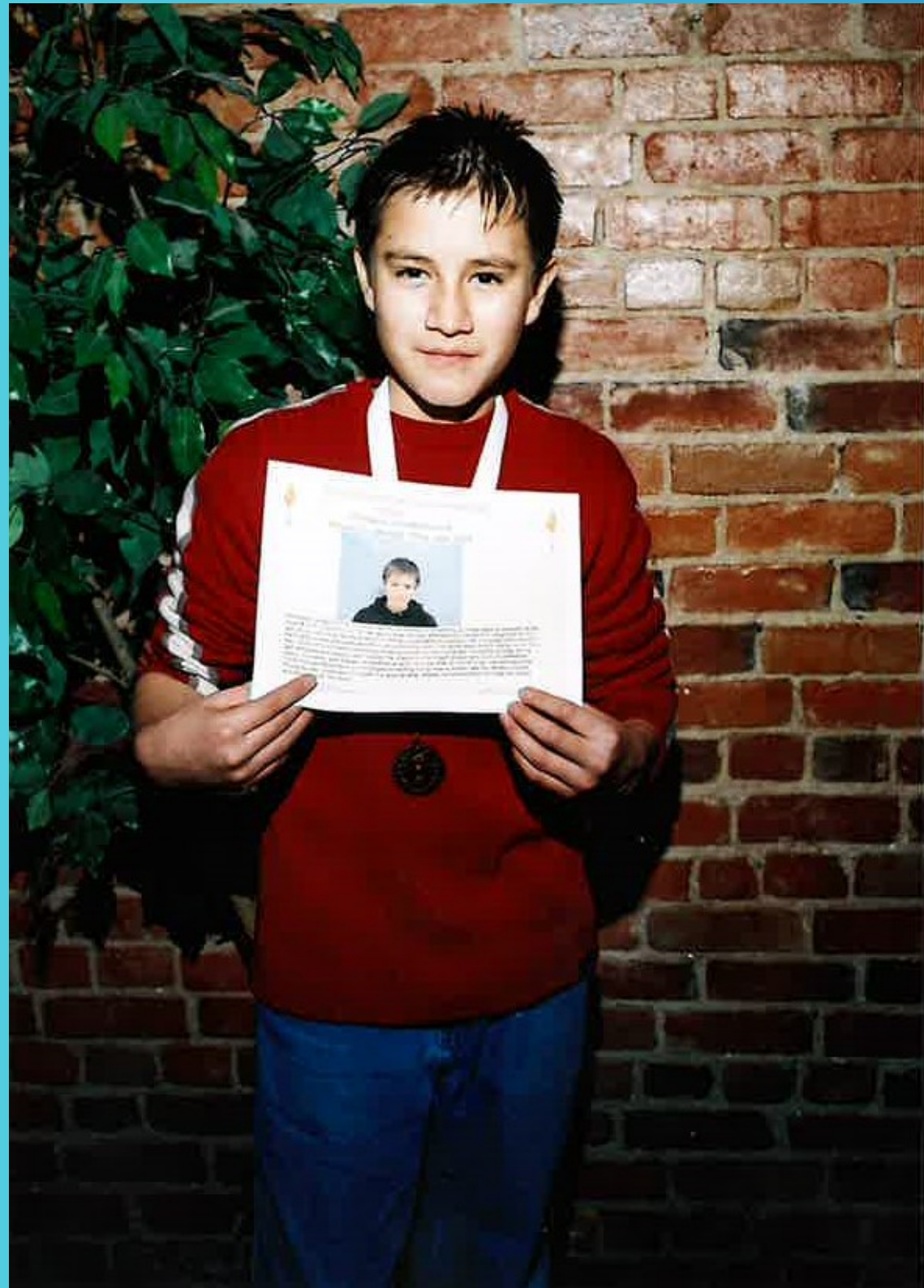

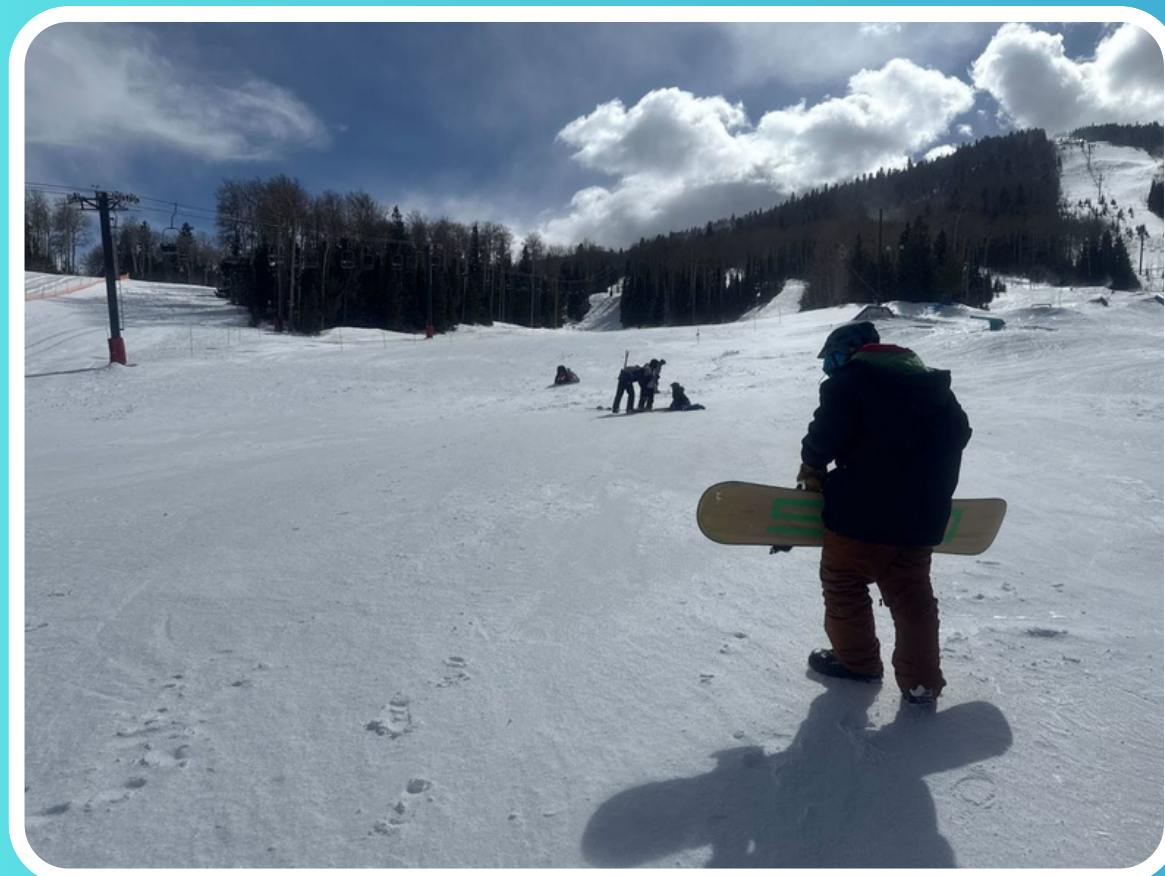

2025 Outcomes

- **39,941** hours of community service or leadership training
- **100%** of our members progressed to the next grade on time
- **85%** of members report that they know what career they want to work toward
- **96%** reported they have supportive adult relationships at the Clubs
- **87%** felt a strong sense of belonging at the Clubs

Our Investment in Pueblo County

- We employ 75 people across Pueblo County
 - \$2.3 million annual payroll
 - approx. \$2.5M of our funding comes from outside Pueblo County
- Every \$1 invested in the Club produces → \$6.32 of economic impact, a total of \$32.5M
